Cost

£4 per child for a 2 hour visit (minimum fee of £60), or £2 per head for a self-guided visit (no minimum fee or maximum number of children).

2 adults go free with every 10 children.

We can accommodate up to 30 children per 2 hour visit, if you would like to bring more than this number we are able to accommodate but will need to speak with you first to arrange.

We have teamed up with the National Waterways Museum Gloucester (also based in Gloucester Docks) to offer an all day visit, with prices starting at £6 per child.

Primary School Visits



The Soldiers of Gloucestershire Museum currently offers two taught education sessions for Primary Schools.

These sessions focus on either World War One, or World War Two, and look at the part played by those serving with the Gloucestershire Regiments and how the lives of the people of the County were affected.

See below for a brief outline of each session.



World War One in Gloucestershire


This session gives a good overview of the First World War but also looks at how the lives of the people of Gloucestershire were affected—both on the frontline and at home. The visit lasts for 2 hours and includes a one hour taught session in our Regimental Boardroom, and an interactive trail through the museum galleries.

The children will handle real objects from the First World War during the visit and learn about joining up, going to War, being a soldier on the frontline, and how the lives of those left behind at home were affected.

World War Two in Gloucestershire

This session gives a good overview of the Second World War but also looks at how the lives of the people of Gloucestershire were affected. The visit lasts for 2 hours and includes a one hour taught session, and an interactive trail through the museum galleries.

The children will handle real objects and learn about going to War, the Home front (and rationing), the Gloucestershire Regiment, and Blackouts and Air raids.
